Today's Scripture & Insight

A viral video of a mama bear trying to get her four energetic little cubs across a busy street brought a knowing smile to my face. It was delightfully relatable to watch her pick up her cubs one-by-one and carry them across the road—only to have the cubs wander back to the other side. After many seemingly frustrating attempts, the mama bear finally corralled all four of her cubs, and they made it safely across the road.

The tireless work of parenting symbolized in the video matheces imagery used by Paul to describe his care for the people in the church of Thessalonica. Instead of emphasizing his authority, the apostle compared his work among them to a mother and father caring for young children (1 Thessalonians 2:7, 11). It was deep love for the Thessalonians (v. 8) that motivated Paul's ongoing efforts to encourage, comfort, and urge them "to live lives worthy of God" (v. 12). This impassioned call to godly living was borne out of his loving desire to see them honour God in all areas of their lives.

Paul's example can serve as a guide for us in all our leadership opportunities—especially when the responsibilities make us weary. Empowered by God's Spirit, we can gently and persistently love those under our care as we encourage and guide them toward Jesus.





Outdoor play the SunSmart way!



SunSmart acknowledges the importance of active, outdoor play for overall health and development.

To ensure children can engage in fun, sun safe outdoor play throughout the day, please follow the 5 SunSmart steps during the daily sun protection times.











Why?

Too much of the sun's UV radiation can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage and skin cancer. Infants and toddlers up to four years of age are particularly vulnerable to UV damage due to lower levels of melanin and a thinner stratum comeum (the outermost layer of skin). UV damage accumulated during childhood and adolescence is associated with an increased risk of skin cancer later in life.

How?

Check SunSmart's daily sun protection times so you know when you do and don't need sun protection each day. These are available as a free app, online (sunsmart.com.au or mvuv.com.au), in the weather section of the newspaper or as a free website widget. Perhaps you can add the widget to your service's website?

If you can't check the sun protection times each day, use these 5 SunSmart steps from mid-August to the end of April in Victoria (NOT just terms one and four).

- Slip on cool, covering clothing that covers as much skin as possible.
- Slop on SPF 30 (or higher) broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen. Make sure you apply a generous amount and keep reapplying it every 2 hours. Check the expiry date.

- Slap on a wide brimmed hat that shades the face, neck, ears and eyes. Baseball or peak caps don't measure up so leave those on the hat rack!
- Seek shade try a shady tree, verandah, pergola or shade sail, umbrella or tepee!
- Slide on some sunglasses where practical. They should be labelled AS 1067 so you know they are UV protected.

Shady play

Good quality shade can reduce overall exposure to the sun's UV. When combined with appropriate clothing, hats and sunscreen, children can be well protected from UV overexposure when outdoors.

Research shows that spacious preschool environments with trees, shrubbery, and broken ground triggers more physical activity and provides better sun protection in outdoor play. Shady and natural play spaces are also requirements of the Education and Care Services National Regulations (Reg. 113.114)



Fish Potato Gem Bake

Prep and Cook: 0:50

Ingredients

- 500 g frozen potato gems
- 1 x 40 g sachet French onion soup
- 125 ml (1/2 cup) boiling water
- 3/4 cup (185 ml) cooking cream
- 425 g cooked fish or a can of tuna in springwater, drained
- 400 g frozen mixed vegetable (such as peas, corn & carrot)
- 100 g (1 cup) pre-grated cheese

Method

- Preheat the oven to 210/190 degrees C fan forced. Arrange potato gems on a baking tray lined with baking paper. Bake for 15 minutes or until crisp. Set aside to cool slightly.
- Place contents of French onion soup sachet in a large jug. Add the boiling water and whisk with a fork until combined. Add the cream and fish and stir to combine.
- Place the vegetables in the base of a 2L (8-cup) baking dish. Pour over the cream mixture. Arrange the potato gems over the top. Sprinkle with the cheese.
- Bake for 20-25 minutes or until golden.
