#### **Today's Scripture & Insight**

As our adopted granny lay in her hospital bed after suffering several strokes, her doctors were unsure of the amount of brain damage she had endured. They needed to wait until she was a bit better to test her brain function. She spoke very few words and even fewer were understandable. But when the eighty-six-year-old woman who had babysat my daughter for twelve years saw me, she opened her parched mouth and asked: "How is Kayla?". The first words she spoke to me were about my child whom she had loved so freely and fully.

Jesus loved children too and put them in the forefront even though His disciples disapproved. Some parents would seek out Christ and present their children to Him. He chose to bless the children as He "[placed] his hands on them" (<u>Luke 18:15</u>). But not everyone was happy that He was blessing little ones. The disciples scolded the parent and asked them to quit bothering Jesus. But He intervened and said, "Let the children come to me" (v,16). He called them an example of how we should receive God's kingdom—with simple dependence, trust, and sincerity.

Young children rarely have a hidden agenda. What you see is what you get. As our heavenly Father helps us regain childlike trust, may our faith and dependence on Him be as open as a child's.

### Trincipal's Report

#### Dear Parents/Caregivers,

The end of term 3 at CCS is approaching rapidly and children are hard at work in their classrooms and making good progress. The weather has finally turned and although there is occasionally still a chill in the air, we are now experiencing some warm weather.

I would like to welcome Lynn and Liam into Carnarvon Christian School. They come to us all the way from Germany so make yourself known to family and give them a warm welcome. I am sure that the family will have a lot to contribute to both our school and Carnarvon community.

30 Year 10 students and their teachers from Geraldton Christian School (GCS) have now arrived and have settled in at CCS for what will be a week's program. This year the team is led by Lindsay Graieg, who also led the initial group of students from what was then known as Strathalbyn Christian School 10 years ago. Like other years, our students will be rotating through lessons in Art, Drama, music, sport and science. GCS is also providing a team of students who will be carrying out work/maintenance projects around the school. We are absolutely thrilled to have our visitors and I am sure that this will again be an excellent learning experience for all involved.

This Thursday, 7th of September, commencing at 1:30 pm will hold a small assembly in the undercover area to farewell the GCS team. One of our students has won a special award, competing with over 40 other schools in the mid-west region. Please come along as we will be making a special presentation to that student. It is a very significant achievement for them.

### Trincipal's Report

Earlier in the term we celebrated National Science Week, setting aside a whole afternoon for students to participate in a Round-Robin of experiments which were set up by our resident scientist, Dr Christin Manser. Yes, you read correctly! Christin was previously an Associate Professor at the UWA Oceans Institute. She has worked in her field around the world, including 14 months researching in Antarctica and has written many scientific papers. Christin has been given authority from TRBWA to teach science at CCS and she is now spending some of her time teaching our students Science.

I was privileged to attend at a community event recently, which spotlighted homelessness. Andrea Muslin spoke about what is a problem—not just in the cities—but throughout Australia including the rural regions like Carnarvon. There are many causes of homelessness, including drug and alcohol addictions, mental illness etc., but what really rang a bell is the increasing number of people who find themselves without a home because of the rental crisis. Carnarvon has shelter for woman and children but currently does not have a place for men. This is worth noting and something that would be worth fighting for.

I would like to thank those parents/caregivers who came along to our assembly celebrating Book Week. Our students dressed up as book characters and paraded their costumes at the assembly. As I have mentioned many times, reading books (fiction and non-fiction) is highly valued at CCS and students should be encouraged to read often and widely.

This week will be our School Faction Athletics Carnival. All the jumps, distance running and shotput will be held on Thursday, followed by the sprints and team events on Friday. Parents are most welcome on either, or both days. Unfortunately, we cannot give exact times to Thursday events as the children will be rotating between jumps, throws and distance running. 


